Please encourage and allow students to submit late work if they can prior to the end of the marking period. (April 3, 2020). If students need additional time to complete this work, they should contact their teacher to discuss an extension.

For the third marking period only, no grade lower than a *55% will appear on a report card in grades 6-12.

Report cards for the third marking period will be mailed home.

Work issued and returned from April 6, 2020 onward, will be graded and will count towards the students average for marking period 4. Final grade determination for marking period 4 will be determined at a later date.
